

General Audition Information

- ★ All students wishing to be cast in our production will need to complete the audition process.
- ★ To sign up, a parent/guardian must complete the After School Enrichment Registration Form at www.redoaksschool.org/musical. (Also found on Blackbaud in the Parent Resources section.) You will be notified with your specific date and time block.
- ★ If you have ANY rehearsal conflicts please make a note in the appropriate section of the audition form.
- ★ If you aren't called back that doesn't necessarily mean we are not seeing you for a role. It just means that we have seen enough from you already.

Vocal & Reading Audition

- An accompanist will be provided.
- You must be on time for your audition.
- Those auditioning will come in one by one to present their song and reading. We would like for the section of the song to be memorized. You may hold a paper for the short monologue.
- Once you have finished your audition you may leave.
- Those in attendance: Director, Choreographer, Music Director and Stage Manager.
- On audition day, please check in with the Stage Manager and wait patiently outside the auditorium in the holding room.
- Audition material will be in this packet.
- If needed, we will email about callbacks on January 27 with additional material.

MATILDA (Female)

An imaginative girl who is clever and wise beyond her years. She has a thirst for learning that cannot be quenched. Magical and curious. Must look young, plays 6 years old. Vocal range: Top D5 Bottom: A3

MISS TRUNCHBULL (Male or Female)

Headmistress of Crunchem Hall Primary School. Miss Honey's aunt. Once a famous athlete, she is described as a "gigantic Holy terror", a "fierce tyrannical monster" who "marches like a storm trooper with long arms swinging" with an aura of menace" Vocal: High baritone with a strong F sharp.

MISS HONEY (Female)

A mild, quiet person who never raises her voice and seldom seems to smile - yet possesses the rare gift of being adored by every small child under her care. She should have curious warmth that is almost tangible.

Vocal: Soprano up to Bb, with a strong and solid belt up to D.

Lyrical pure sounding voice. Could even have a slightly folksy quality.

MR WORMWOOD (Male)

A dealer in second-hand cars - "a mean crooked crook" - with a penchant for wearing jackets with large, brightly colored checks. Should ideally be a clown and could have an ex-punkish rocker voice.

MRS WORMWOOD (Female)

Mother of Michael and Matilda, and the wife of Mr. Wormwood. She is obsessed with her amateur Ballroom dancing partner and her looks. Like her husband she thinks very little of Matilda's unique abilities and often berates her. She is as loud in her makeup and dress sense as she is in her voice.

MRS PHELPS (Female)

Warm and nurturing local librarian who encourages Matilda's love of reading. She has an inner peace.

MICHAEL WORMWOOD

Matilda's older brother. He is not very bright and favored by their parents. Comedic actor

MALE ENSEMBLE / RUDOLPHO (Male)

Mrs. Wormwood's dance partner. Should be genuinely fit and athletic. Should have a flare for character comedy.

MALE ENSEMBLE / SERGEI

Russian Mafia Boss who is physically intimidating, with an accomplished Russia accent.

THE "LITTLE KIDS":

BRUCE

Essential Vocal ability for "Revolting Children". Acting ability. Comic. As part of the action on stage this role is required to eat chocolate cake, cream & icing. Must not be allergic to latex (material of the prop cake) or cake/icing ingredients Vocal: Top: Eb5 Bottom: C4

LAVENDER

Essential Good dance. Strong singing and acting. Loud and kooky - likes to have fun - big personality. Vocal: Top: E5 Bottom: C4

AMANDA

Strong dance and vocal ability.

ALICE

Essential Strong and Bold. Strong dance and vocal ability.

HORTENSIA

Essential Feisty. Strong dance and vocal ability.

ERIC

Small as possible. Strong dance and vocal ability.

NIGEL

Essential Vocal stamina for spoken dialogue. Strong dance ability. Strong vocal ability.

TOMMY

Essential Strong dance and vocal ability.

THE "BIG" KIDS

A very STRONG group of dancers and singers. They are the tough kids at the school and perform the shows biggest singing and dancing numbers: EX: Revolting children. There are solo lines, parts in this group. These kids have to be substantially bigger than the little kids...so teenagers.

MECHANIC, PARENTS, COOK, HENCHMAN, and SCHOOL CHILDREN. Other featured parts with solos & lines. These characters will play numerous roles in the show. Acting, singing AND dance needed for these roles.

some tips for the

theater

Don't upstage yourself. **Cheat out** so the audience can always see your face and hear your voice. Always arrive at rehearsal on time and ready to begin. Keep going! If you forget a line or something unexpected happens, keep the scene moving forward. Chances are, the audience won't even notice.

and fellow

members.

It takes an

is important.

Be respectful of others at all times.

If you are having trouble memorizing your lines, try writing them down or speaking them aloud.

Bring your script and a pencil to every rehearsal. Be specific! Make clear choices about your character's background and motivation in the show.

Before the show, say "break a leg" – which means "good luck" in the theater.

Always be quiet
backstage. And keep
in mind, if you can see
the audience, they can
see you, so stay out
of sight.



Roald Dahl's Matilda The Musical JR. SYNOPSIS

Matilda The Musical JR, opens with enthusiastic school children (and their equally enthusiastic parents) singing their own praises... except MATILDA. According to her parents, she is nothing but a nuisance (Miracle). At Matilda's home her father, MR. WORMWOOD, reveals his scheme to sell old automobiles as brandnew luxury cars to Russian businessmen. Matilda doesn't believe this is fair and goes to her room, pausing on the way to mix her father's hair tonic with her mother's hair dye (Naughty). The next morning, Mr. Wormwood's hair is green.

Matilda drops by the library to visit MRS. PHELPS, the librarian. She tells Mrs. Phelps part one of the tale of the ACROBAT and the ESCAPOLOGIST, two circus performers deeply in love. The tale cuts off just as the couple is primed to perform their most dangerous trick. Matilda starts her first day of school the next morning (School Song). Fortunately, Matilda's teacher is MISS HONEY, a woman who cares deeply for her students. Miss Honey immediately recognizes Matilda's advanced intelligence, prompting her to visit the school's vicious headmistress, MISS TRUNCHBULL. The teacher hopes to promote Matilda to a more challenging class, but Trunchbull refuses (The Hammer).

Mr. Wormwood returns home, furious that the Russians did not fall for his scheme. Matilda lines the rim of her father's hat with superglue (Naughty -Supergiue - Part 2). At school the next day, Matilda's classmate NIGEL is in a panic, saying he has been blamed for a trick on Trunchbull. If she finds him, she will put him in the infamous chokey, a cupboard lined with nails, spikes, and broken glass (Chokey Chant). Matilda tells the students to throw their coats onto Nigel. When Trunchbull storms onstage, Matilda tells her Nigel has been asleep under the coats for the last hour due to his sleeping disorder. Trunchbull

reluctantly accepts this explanation.

At the Wormwood home, Miss Honey tries to explain to MRS. WORMWOOD how special her daughter is, but she doesn't listen, returning to her dancing lesson with RUDOLPHO. Miss Honey feels helpless (This Little Girl). At the library, Matilda continues the circus story for Mrs. Phelps. The Escapologist announces that their act is cancelled because his wife, the Acrobat, is pregnant. However, the Acrobat's sister refuses to cancel the act.

At school the following day, Trunchbull bursts into the classroom, accusing Matilda of eating a piece of her cake – but the culprit turns out to be **BRUCE**. Trunchbull punishes the boy by forcing him to eat the rest of the cake in one sitting, and the kids cheer as he finishes the cake (Bruce - Part 1). Despite his victory, Trunchbull takes Bruce to the chokey. Matilda is upset by the unfairness of this. She goes to the library, launching into the next part of her dramatic circus tale. The Acrobat is killed during the performance – but not before giving birth to a baby girl. The children in Matilda's school sing about what life will be like when they grow up. Miss Honey and Matilda join in (When I Grow Up).

At the Wormwood home, Mr. Wormwood announces that by tweaking the speedometers in his cars, he has completed a successful business deal with the Russians. Matilda is disgusted. In her room, Matilda finishes the story: the Escapologist leaves to confront his treacherous sister-in-law, but never

The next day at school, Trunchbull believes the students are up to something (The Smell Of Rebellion). Her fears are confirmed when LAVENDER puts a newt into Trunchbull's water jug, causing pandemonium. Everything slows down as Matilda explains to the audience that she can sometimes find calmness in herself that allows her to do amazing things (Quiet). She uses her ability to throw the glass with the newt at Trunchbull, who screams and runs. Matilda reveals her ability to Miss Honey, who admits that she is poor and lives in a shed. Her father died when she was little, and her cruel aunt became the owner of her childhood home. Miss Honey suspects her aunt killed her father, and reluctantly reveals that her aunt is none other than Trunchbull.

The next day, Trunchbull challenges Miss Honey's class to a spelling test. The students spell every word right. When Trunchbull claims a student has misspelled a word and tries to drag her to the chokey, the whole class begins spelling incorrectly in solidarity. Writing appears on the chalkboard, apparently written by Trunchbull's dead brother-in-law (but actually magically written by Matilda). Trunchbull leaves and the children sing in joy (Revolting Children).

Miss Honey inherits her parents' house and takes over the role of headmistress. Just before Matilda is whisked off to Spain by her family who are on the run from the Russian mob, Miss Honey has a proposition: let Matilda stay with her. The Wormwoods agree, and Matilda and Miss Honey are both overjoyed (Bows).






